<p>Additional Requirements: A minimum GPA of 2.0 on all coursework. Passing Score on all required parts of the FCAT</p> <p>Students scoring at a Level 1 or 2 on the FCAT Reading will be required to taking an Intensive reading/language arts Class . This may be a 1 or 2 credit class depending on fluency level of the student. This requirement is for all students.</p> <p>Currently all students scoring a Level 1 on FCAT Math will be required to take an Intensive Math class in addition to their math course. .ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

No more than (2) Remedial or Compensatory credits allowed as elective for graduation. No more than three (3) credits in Practical Arts Home Economics classes. These are courses in vocationally oriented Home Economics. No more than one-half (1/2) credit for Exploratory Vocation course which are designed to familiarize the person with the world of work and to motivate them to pursue courses in Vocational Ed.

DIPLOMA AND CERTIFICATE OF COMPLETION, STANDARD DIPLOMA:

Diploma awarded to students who have mastered eleventh grade minimum student performance standards, successfully completed the minimum number of academic credits and other requirements prescribed by the local school boards, and passed the FCAT.

SPECIAL DIPLOMA:

Diploma awarded to students who have been properly classified in any of special education categories, met all applicable requirements prescribed by the school board, and demonstrated mastery of the appropriate minimum number of credits and all other requirements prescribed by the local school board, but failed to meet eleventh grade minimum students performance standards as prescribed in the State Board of Education Rule.

CERTIFICATE OF COMPLETION:

Any student who meets the required credits for graduation, but fails to pass the FCAT and/or has below a 2.0 grade point average, will be awarded a Certificate of Completion. Students should check with the appropriate community college for transfer information.

ACCELERATED GRADUATION OPTION

Two 18 credit accelerated graduation options have been created by the Florida legislature. Students must fill out an Accelerated Graduation Option within the first 10 days school is in session in order to qualify. Students may select the College Prep 18 Credit Option, or the Career Prep 18 Credit Option. The student should carefully consider if this is an appropriate choice by discussing these 18-credit options with his/her guidance counselor.
